Raymond Bernier

Ray was born in Norwich and grew up in Sprague. He played youth sports in Sprague, Franklin, and Norwich prior to attending NFA and then onto Assumption College graduating with degrees in Chemistry and Biology. In 2003 he married his wife, Diane. They have

raised two daughters, Ally age 17 and Emma age 16 who both play interscholastic sports at RHAM High school. Ray has been an educator for 24 years. For the past 20 years he has been a Principal in the Preston School system.

Ray graduated from NFA in 1993. He was a 3-sport athlete (Wrestling, Baseball, and Football). Wrestling became his forte. He was a late bloomer in wrestling but by his Senior year he excelled in the sport.

As a Senior Ray was named Captain of the wrestling team. He was a Gold Medalist at the Nutmeg State Olympics, was the State LL Champion, voted the most improved wrestler, and also was named to the New London Day all area team. In his Senior year Ray's record was 30-Wins and 1-Loss. In over 100 career matches he was never pinned. Ray also captained the baseball team his senior year.

Ray was honored with several prestigious awards upon graduating from NFA: The Varsity "N" Club Award for the most valuable wrestler, the Dr. Joseph Levanto Award to an athlete who earns 3- Varsity Letters in the same year, the Varsity "N" Club Cup to a Senior student with outstanding achievements in athletics, and the Dr. Maurice "Mace" Goldblatt Award to a Sr. member of the baseball team whose academics and character are the highest ranking on the team.

During his high school years, to satisfy his thirst for competing in organized sports after high school, Ray began taking private lessons in Jiu Jitsu, karate, judo, boxing, and mixed martial arts. Between 1992 and 1999 he competed in numerous sanctioned competitions in CT and other New England States. His hard work and dedication paid off by winning the Nutmeg State Olympic Games Gold Medal and the CT State Judo Championship in 1992. In 1995 Ray was the Massachusetts State Judo Champion and in 1999 he won a Bronze Medal in the New England Jiu Jitsu Championship competition.

Ray turned to coaching in 1999 and coached for 24 years: 1999 to 2004 Preston Middle school wrestling, 2005 to 2008 youth jiu jitsu and from 2011 to 2016 Marlborough youth soccer. He had a team that was ranked 8th in the State out of 67 teams. In 2014 he coached Marlborough youth softball, 2015 to 2019 RHAM youth lacrosse and in 2022 his daughter's lacrosse team to a championship at the Wide World of Indoor Sports in Montville, beating out 8 other teams.

Kafi Davis



During Kafi's high school career, she competed in basketball for 2 seasons, indoor track for 2 seasons and cross country and outdoor track for 4 seasons earning 12 letters.

The basketball team won the ECC regular season and ECC tournament both years and captured the state championship in 1999 finishing with a 27-0 record. Her 4 years in the cross country program produced 4 ECC

league and ECC tournament titles culminating in state championships in 1995 and 1997. Kafi earned All-Conference and All-State honors her senior year.

Kafi's 6 seasons competing in track and field is where she excelled. Her sophomore year in indoor track, she won the long jump at the ECC's earning All-Conference. At the state meet she won the long jump earning All-State while also setting a school, Class LL and state record. The state Class LL record still stands.

Over her 4 years on the outdoor track team, Kafi was the leading

scorer and earned All-Conference and All-State each year. As a freshman Kafi won the 100m at the ECC's along with anchoring the winning 4X100 relay. She placed in the long jump and was part of the winning 4X100 relay. At the state open she was 4th in the long jump and again the 4X100 relay was first. Kafi had similar results during her sophomore year competing in the same events. She was the anchor of the 4X100 relay that won class LL setting a school record. Despite the incredible accomplishments her first 2 years, she continued to improve through her junior year. Kafi won the 100M, long jump and 4X100 relay at the ECC and Class LL championships. Her long jump distance was a Class LL state record. She was second in the long jump and 4X100 at the state open and finished her incredible season winning the 100M and long jump at the New England championships. School records were set this season in the 100M, long jump and 4X100 relay. Senior year accomplishments included winning the long jump and 4X400 relay at the state meet. The overall team accomplishments during Kafi's career include winning the ECC, ECC tournament and class LL all 4 years, winning 2 State Opens and finishing with an overall 38-0 record.

Kafi received numerous awards at the completion of her high school career including the Athletic Council Cup. She was awarded a Martin Luther King scholarship and received a full scholarship to compete in track and field at the University of Connecticut.



Tony Gizio

Over the past forty-five years NFA has had an excellent wrestling program. The 1990's produced some of NFA's strongest teams. Strong teams are made up of superb wrestlers. From 1990-1994 Tony Gizio has to be considered as one of NFA's most outstanding wrestler's the program has produced.

Tony Gizio grew up in Canterbury and began developing his skills by competing in Judo and youth wrestling. From an early age his fierce sense of competition and desire for individual achievement made Tony an ideal candidate for wrestling in high school. Entering NFA in 1990, Tony would develop and elevate his skills eventually leading him to great success.

Under coaches Carl Snitkin and Roy Wentworth, Tony wrestled as a middle-weight in the 145 lb. weight class. It would be a division that he would dominate locally, state wide, and in New England during high school years. From 1991-1994 Tony's combined record was 66-2-1. He would win two State Open titles, two New England titles and was selected as a National High School Coaches Association All-American. He currently holds four individual NFA wrestling records: The most takedowns in one season (1992-93) of 106, the most dual meet pins in one season (1993-94) of 21, the fastest pin (1993-94) of .5 seconds tying the National Record at the time (about the time it takes the referee to blow his whistle!), and the most points scored in a single match (1993-94) of 42. While Tony was individually successful, NFA's wrestling team at the time was dominant and would be ranked as high as 18th nationally.

An unbelievably successful wrestling career has led to well-deserved honors. In the forty-five year history of NFA's high profile Wrestling program, Tony was the only three time winner of the Team's Most Outstanding Varsity Wrestler. In 2016, the inaugural class selected from Connecticut, Tony was inducted into the Connecticut Chapter of the National Wrestling Hall of Fame.

Wrestling is a tough sport requiring athletic skill. To excel at high levels demands great determination, intensity and inner strength. When you combine great skill and tenacity, wrestlers like Tony Gizio step forward. His achievements help us understand just how good a wrestler Tony was.

Tony now no longer worries about making weight and winning titles. Living in Stonington, Tony is married to his high school sweetheart Erin. Together, they have a 9 year old daughter, Eva.



Jennifer (Rathbun) Guernsey

While attending NFA, Jennifer was a three-sport student athlete, earning a total of 10 varsity letters. She was a four-year varsity player in softball and a three-year varsity player in soccer and basketball. She was the recipient of the Charles Scarlata Memorial Award for Outstanding Contribution to Girls' Basketball (1996-1997) and the Joseph Levanto

Versatility Award (1997) for Outstanding Achievement in three sports. Jen also received the Wildcat Scramble Scholarship Award (1997).

The NFA Girls Basketball and Softball teams experienced tremendous success during Jen's four years. In 1997, the Softball team was one of the regular season ECC Co-Champions, ECC Tournament Champions and reached the Class LL semifinals before bowing out of the tournament. For her efforts, Jen was a two-time member of the New London Day All Area Softball Team for 1996 and 1997. The Girls' Basketball team was undefeated during the regular season for three consecutive years from 1994-1997, winning 54 straight games. During this three-year period, the team was ECC regular season and tournament champions while winning the Class LL Championship in 1995-1996 and 1996-1997. Jen was the point guard and served as team captain in 1997.

During the summers of her Freshman and Sophomore years at NFA, Jen was a member of Senior League Softball. In 1993 and 1994, her team was District 11 Champions. In 1994, the team went on to become State and New England Champions, while finishing as East Regional Championship Runner-up.

Jen continued her athletic career on a softball athletic scholarship at Division 1 Central Connecticut State University. From 1998-2001, she was a four-year starter at shortstop and second base. In 1999, Jen was selected as the Student-Athlete Most Improved Academic Player.

Jen has been a local youth recreation and school coach in soccer, basketball and softball. She coached Lebanon Boys and Girls Youth Soccer 2013-2019, earning Coach of The Year in 2015. She has been Franklin Recreation Basketball Coach for boys and girls since 2016 to the present. Jen also coached the Franklin Middle School Soccer team in 2020-2021 and the Girls Basketball Team 2021-2023. The 2021-2022 team went undefeated and was SEMSAC League and Tournament Champions. From 2013-2020, Jen was the Sprague-Franklin-Canterbury Little League Coach. In 2019, the team was District 11 Little League Softball Champions, ages 9-11. Jen is currently a third-grade teacher at Hebron Elementary school, a position she has held for the last 19 years.

Robert Larkham



Rob Larkham, Class of 1985, was a four -year member of the NFA wrestling team under legendary coach, Carl Snitkin. Rob's talent in wrestling was indisputable as early as his freshman year, weighing in at 91pounds and earning fourth overall in the Class LL tournament. By his sophomore year, Rob became increasingly more competitive, and wrestled in the 98- pound

weight class to take second overall in the Class LL tournament. By his junior and senior years, Rob's presence was well-known as he earned the NFA's "Most Outstanding Wrestler" award. At the state level, Rob finished first in the Class LL tournament and second at the State Open in his junior year at 119 pounds, with an astounding record of 15-3-1. As a senior, Rob dominated another weight class of 132 pounds, remaining undefeated in dual meets at 17-0, and thus played a significant role in his team winning the LL State Championship for the third consecutive year. Consistent with his junior year, Rob also won the Class LL tournament as a senior. More impressively, Rob won the State Open and became NFA's first State Open champion in wrestling. Rob was voted Outstanding Athlete of the 1985 Graduating Class at NFA and was co-captain of the wrestling team his senior year. Rob was also a member of the Junior National Greco Roman Team in 1985, a member of the Junior National Free Style Team in 1985, and a 2018 inductee in the Norwich Free Academy Sports Hall of Fame.



Danny Murphy (d)

Daniel Francis Murphy was born in Philadelphia in August 1876 and moved to Fall River, Mass. after living a brief time in Providence, R.I. Danny worked in a mill and played for its amateur baseball team before beginning to earn extra income by playing for semi-pro teams sponsored by athletic clubs and businesses. In 1896, he was hired by North Attleboro to play for the town's semi-pro team and

was given a job in a jewelry factory. In 1900, he moved to Norwich to play on a minor league team which won the Connecticut State League Championship. Murphy was credited with being a major part of that achievement. He signed with the New York Giants later that year and played into the 1901 season. After being let go by the Giants, he returned to Norwich to play with his original team.

In 1902 two major events happened to Danny, first he was signed by the Philadelphia Athletics, and he married his Norwich girlfriend, Catherine Moriarty. Danny lived on 75 Spring Street in Norwich, later moving to her family's hotel for the better part of 20 years. He was a key player for the Philadelphia Athletics who was credited as "the heart and soul that made them champions in the World Series in 1910, 1911, and 1913." The Athletics were also American League champions in 1902 and 1905. He set an American League record for assists in a game by a second baseman, and both offensive and defensive World Series records as an outfielder. "The legendary coach Connie Mack named him the top right fielder on the teams he led during his 50 seasons." Murphy competed in 1,496 games and had a batting average of .289, while scoring 705 runs. He produced 289 doubles, 103 triples, 44 home runs, and 702 RBI's, with 193 stolen bases. He played 16 World Series games with a .305 batting average with one home run and 12 RBI's.

Initially Catherine stayed in Norwich during the season with Danny returning during the offseason. Eventually, she would join him to make a home in Norwich for the winter months. Danny was highly celebrated in Norwich with parades and other events during his playing days and for many years to come. For a time while he was playing, he owned a downtown "café" featuring cigars and liquor, and later a saloon on Bath Street. His days in Norwich came to a close with Catherine's death late in 1918 due to the Spanish Flu pandemic. He was invited by her siblings to move to Jersey City, NJ to live with them there. The couple did not have children.

After his playing days he managed a New Haven minor league team during WW1 and then acted as the captain and coach of the Athletics for

the first five years of the 1920's. It was during the latter that he became known as "the Sherlock Holmes of Baseball during his coaching years. He had an uncanny ability to understand an opposing pitcher's changes in their stance, approach, and every other factor no matter how subtle, and relay what kind of pitch he was delivering to his batter." Danny passed away in 1955 and is buried next to his wife in St. Mary's Cemetery. Nate Murphy (d)

Nate Murphy played basketball at the Norwich Free Academy from 1967 to 1971 and he did so at the highest level as he amassed over 1000 point during his scholastic career. Already a well-regarded player upon his arrival at NFA, he was good enough as a freshman to suit up and play in several varsity games.

He earned a starting spot in his sophomore year joining a squad that promised a repeat of a Capitol District Conference championship and a favorite in the year-end state tournament. Nate did not disappoint. He was a team player who could pass magically and steal the ball almost at will. He made a formidable team even better. His role as a team player coupled his skills made that team better. Nate could find an open man and the Wildcat's point men (Zeke Lanier and Bill Wendt) could deliver a basket when he fed them.

He was an essential player who could run, pass, steal the ball, feed it off or take it to the basket. His quickness made him a threat on both sides of the floor. His reedy 6'3" frame gave him wide range to steal a pass and kick off a fast break. He could score inside or outside the paint. Nate was perfectly suited for Coach Tim Ryan's "Iron Man Squad" that saw few substitutions. He had an instinctive sense of where the ball was going.

As a Junior he still carried out his role as a keen defender and a brilliant passer, yet he also transformed into a surefire scoring threat. His ability made the Wildcats a CDC powerhouse for a third-year in a row.

As the Co-Captain of the Wildcats in his senior year, his reputation was solidified. His teammates and his coaches wanted Nate to have the ball and he did not disappoint. Opponents who tried to double team Nate paid the price as two defenders could not keep him from finding an open man.

In his career at NFA Nate scored 1,013 points, only the sixth player in NFA history to do so. Being on the squad, he made his teams and its standouts even better. He developed into a player who could take control of the game when necessary. No opponents could stop him. He finished his career averaging 18.4 points per game.



John Padgett

John Padgett and his family moved to Gales Ferry, Connecticut in the summer of 1962 in the beginning of his sophomore year of high school. He attended Norwich Free Academy and became a three-sport athlete earning a total of 8 varsity letters. Football was his best sport, earning All Capital District Conference honors in 1963 and 1964. John's senior year was highlighted when he served as a co-captain

and was named to the All-State Team.

The 1963 football team was one of the best in the history of NFA. The team compiled a 7-2 overall record, facing some of the best teams in the entire state. John shared the fullback position with Dennis Perry and the hard-hitting duo seemed to dominate the action. According to John, the highlight of the season was the 22-14 victory over New London High School in the 97th meeting of the two schools. In the Hartford Bulkeley victory settled at 21-6, John also accounted for 150 of NFA's 230 rushing yards. The 1964 football team again combined John with Perry on the team giving NFA the best one-two running backs in the entire conference. He would score 2 touchdowns against Hartford Bulkeley and Fitch High Schools in their meetings.

John was a varsity member of the 1964 basketball team that were CDC Champions and finished with a 21-3 record, the best finish ever by an NFA basketball team. The team made it to the state tournament quarter finals and still holds a school record with 99 points scored in a game. John also played for 3 years on coach Rene Ledoux baseball teams. He graduated from Norwich Free Academy in 1965 and attended the United States Naval Academy where he played both football and lacrosse. John moved solely to lacrosse after a football injury and proudly earned First Team All-American Defensive Man in his senior year.

After graduation in 1969, John earned an additional degree from Georgia institute of Technology and went on to serve in the United States Navy as the Commander of the USS Omaha, served as Commoner, Submarine Squadron Eleven, was the 75th Commandant of Midshipman at the U.S. Naval Academy. Following his selection to flag rank, he held over five major Command assignments in the Northeastern United States region. His final assignment was the 30th Commander, Submarine Force in the Pacific and Indian Oceans.
Since 2003, John joined General Dynamics Electric Boat as Vice-President of Submarine maintenance and modernization and served as CEO of the Naval Submarine League. John is now retired, but doing

some consulting and is living with his wife Bobbie, in Old Lyme.

Joseph Kapteina Service Award Recipient



Leonard Miller

This year's Kaptiena Award Winner was born in Hartford, CT on March 28, 1979. He moved to Norwich in 1991. Soon after he began playing basketball in junior high and playing Night Flight basketball, which was started in 1991 by Lou Allen and John lovino.

He played basketball at NFA from 1993 to 1997. He was voted All-ECC in 1996-1997 and later attended Western CT University where he played basketball. He also attended Westfield State University for two years and received his Associate Degree from Three Rivers Community College.

Leonard coached youth football in the Norwich Youth Football League, basketball in the Norwich Rec League and AAU Teams.

In 2018, inspired by the Willimantic City Leagues Leonard, Eugene Gibson and Kara Turner restarted Night Flight Basketball. It began with a Men's Winter League and Christmas Tournament. In the Summer of 2019 Leonard began the Summer League, which consisted of Men's, Women's, Junior Boys and Girls Leagues at Jenkins Park on the West Side of Norwich. In the same year Leonard began Basketball Camps supported by the Norwich Police Athletic League.

In 2020 Leonard began a ten team Co-Ed Softball League at Kelly Field. This year's Summer Basketball Leagues will begin in June at Jenkins Park. Thursday nights are scheduled for the Women's and Junior Leagues with Friday's for the Men's Leagues.

Leonard is also Planning a Flag Football League, possibly this fall, reminiscent of the old Sunday mornings Flag Football at the Rec Field.

Over the years Night Flight Basketball has received funding help from Mayor Peter Nystrom, Police Chief Patrick Daley and State Representative Derrell Wilson. These contributions will help with Winter Leagues, the Over-35 League and Youth Basketball Camps this summer at Jenkins Park.




