Myles Bradley



Myles played many sports while growing up in Norwich. Among them, he played basketball, baseball, soccer, and participated in Judo. As a young man watching the 1996 Summer Olympics in Atlanta Georgia, running inspired Myles by watching Michael Johnson who won the Gold Medal in both the 200- and 400-Meter dash.

In his freshman year at NFA in 2002, he connected with Coach Jemal Davis who guided Myles for the next four years in the long jump, the triple jump, the high jump, and the high hurdles. His first year he won both the ECC Conference and Class LL state titles in the triple jump.

As a junior, he won both the long jump and the 55m hurdles during the indoor season. That spring, Myles claimed the ECC titles in the 110 and the 300 hurdles, as well as another new event, the high jump. At the Class LL Meet, he won the 110 hurdles, the long jump, and the triple jump. At the State Open, he won both the long jump and the 110m hurdles. During his senior year, Myles won the State Open Championship in the 110 hurdles, the long jump, and the triple jump. The NFA track team won four consecutive ECC conference titles and was Class LL State Team Champion in 2004 and 2005 with Myles leading the way. He won two events at the New England Championship Meet; 110 hurdles and the triple jump. In 2005 Myles was named Connecticut Gatorade Track and Field Athlete of the Year. For the past 21 years, he still holds the CT Class LL state records in both hurdle events, as well as the long jump

Myles earned a track scholarship to Stanford University where he set freshman records in the 60 meters dash, 60 meter hurdles and 110 meter hurdles. In his 2009 senior season, he had his best year. He set the indoor Stanford record in the 60m hurdles and placed 5th in the NCAA Meet earning All-American Honors. In the spring season, Myles set the Stanford record in the 110 Hurdles, winning the Conference Title, and the NCAA West Regional Title. He went on to place 4th in the NCAA Championship Meet, again achieving All-American Honors.

The two time All-American captained the Stanford Track Team in his junior and senior seasons. Seventeen years after graduating from Stanford, Myles still holds the indoor (60 Hurdles) and outdoor (110 Hurdles) records at his alma mater.

Myles graduated in 2009 with an economics degree from Stanford then returned to NFA as assistant coach for the indoor and outdoor track teams from 2010 to 2013. He then went on to earn an MBA from the School of Management at Yale University in 2014. Currently, he is the CT Group Regional Operation Director for Davita Kidney Care. Myles lives in New Haven with his wife Ariana and their three children; Lillie, Malcom, and Jayda.

Roland “Beans” Carrignan



Roland “Beans” Carrignan was born in Norwich, CT on July 12, 1925. At a young age, Roland prioritized his family and his country. Unlike other young teenagers that move on to High School, Roland joined the work force after finishing 8th grade to assist his mother with living expenses. After a month of turning 18 years old, Roland enlisted in the Army on August 13, 1943, to serve the U.S. in World War II. He was wounded in

Italy on March 17, 1944, and awarded a Purple Heart for his service. After returning home, Roland took his talents to the ball field, becoming a staple in the Norwich City Baseball League in the 1940s and 1950s. Roland’s tenure playing baseball in the Norwich City League lasted from 1946 through 1952, playing for Uncas AC, Tannery AC, the Polish Cits, Thamesville AC, as well as the Baltic Towners. Roland was both a force at the plate and on the mound as a dominant left-handed pitcher. One of his biggest achievements was on August 15, 1946, when he set a city league strikeout record by striking out 13 batters for Uncas AC. In August 1949, he pitched a dazzling one-hit game for the Tannery AC, by shutting out the Robert O. Fletcher post, American Legion team 2-0. In that game, Beans topped his strikeout record by fanning 14 batters over seven innings. In 1951, Beans was one of the batting leaders for the Polish Cits, finishing the season with a batting average of .514. Roland played alongside the likes of fellow Norwich Sports Hall of Famers such as William Burelle, James Caulfield, Hank Homski, John Lapkowski, Jack Lonardelli, and John Serafin to name a few.

Roland also excelled while playing football. Roland was a key member of the offensive backfield for the 1949 Norwich Bulldogs, who claimed the Quinebaug Valley and Eastern Connecticut Championships. Roland was a boost on offense for the Norwich Ramblers, as he joined the team in the 1950s.

Roland and his wife Alice were well-known for owning the Taftville Package Store for nearly three decades. He gave back to the community by sponsoring baseball teams through Taftville Package Store in both Norwich and Colchester. In 1965, Roland lost his first-born child, Richard, at the age of 10. After that devastating loss, Roland continued to keep his generous spirit by helping others when he could, whether it was donating wine to Sacred Heart Church in Taftville, providing donations to the Taftville Fire Department for special gatherings, or supporting others financially when in need.

Roland’s determination to give his all whether through athletics, business or in his personal life was the epitome of perseverance.

Chris DeLucia



Chris DeLucia was born and raised in Norwich, where he grew up playing in local youth sports and community leagues. His connection to golf started at Norwich Golf Course, where he first learned the game and developed a passion that would shape much of his athletic career. After attending St. Joseph School, Chris went on to Saint Bernard High

At Saint Bernard, Chris was a standout multi-sport athlete. On the basketball court, he was a three-year starter and earned All-ECC Honorable Mention honors. Known for his shooting ability, he made over 200 three-pointers during his high school career.

While Chris had success in basketball, golf became the sport where he established himself as one of the area's premier competitors. During his high school golf career, he was a four-time All-ECC selection, a two-time All-State honoree, and a three-time All-Area selection by both *The Day* and *The Norwich Bulletin*. In 2005, he was the individual medalist in both the ECC Open Championship and the Wildcat Invitational. He was also recognized in 2007 as a CIAC Scholar-Athlete.

Chris continued his golf career at the University of Connecticut, where he competed for the UConn men's golf team for four years. During his collegiate career, he played in 31 tournaments and earned Academic All-Big East golf honors.

Following college, Chris continued to build an impressive amateur golf resume. He is a two-time Norwich Invitational champion and has won 15 combined club championships at Norwich Golf Course and Lake of Isles. His career low round is at Norwich Golf course is 63, which at the time was the course record following course changes.

Chris has been a three-time quarterfinalist in both the Connecticut State Amateur and Rhode Island State Amateur Championships. He has also represented Team Rhode Island three times in the Tri-State competition, an invitational event featuring many of the top amateur players from each state.

Today, Chris lives in Pawcatuck, Connecticut, with his wife, Jen, and their two children, Theodore and Charlotte. He works as a high school guidance counselor at Three Rivers Middle College High School, where he supports students academically and personally. His induction recognizes his athletic accomplishments, his lasting connection to Norwich, and his continued excellence as one of the area's top amateur golfers.

Bryan Moretti



Born in Norwich, Bryan virtually lived at "The Rec" playing in many youth programs; PAL, Norwich Little and Senior League as solid background for his professional career.

Bryan attended NFA playing baseball for two years and basketball for four years being named Captain during his senior year along with his selection as an All-Conference player.

After graduating from NFA, he went on to play basketball at Nichols College where he was awarded "Freshman of the Year" honors due to outstanding performance on the court for the 1993-94 season. He then took his basketball talents to Eastern Connecticut State University (ECSU) where he became an elite scorer reaching the 1,000-Point Club (a combination of points from Nichols and ECSU) along with being selected as a two-year team Captain for the ECSU Warriors. He started in the prestigious Division 3 New England All-Star Game as Holy Cross.

Following college graduation, Moretti seamlessly transitioned into coaching serving as an assistant men's basketball coach at ECSU for two seasons. In the fall of 2003, Bryan relocated to West Hartford after securing a physical education and health teaching position at Hall High School. He immediately immersed himself in the Warriors' Athletic Department, initially joining the football staff as an assistant coach before being appointed head coach of the Boys Varsity basketball program.

Bryan is a cornerstone of the West Hartford athletic community as an elite collegiate basketball player and a highly successful high school coach. For over two decades, his leadership at Hall High School has shaped local athletics. Taking over a program that had experienced three coaching changes in six years and struggled to win games, Moretti brought much-needed stability and culture. His coaching portfolio at Hall eventually expanded across multiple sports: Boys Basketball, Golf, Girls Soccer and Football. The definitive crown jewel of Moretti's coaching tenure occurred on March 6, 2026. In the opening round of the CIAC Division II state tournament, the No. 8 seeded Hall Titans defeated Cheney Tech 49-46. The hard-fought victory marked Bryan's 200th career win at Hall High School also winning the Conference Title that year. Bryan just completed his twenty-third season as Basketball Coach at Hall High School in West Hartford.

Beyond the wins, Bryan remains highly regarded for his community work, partnering with youth athletic initiatives to manage local basketball clinics like his Warrior Hoop School. Bryan currently lives in Wethersfield with wife Yvette, son Jackson and daughter Olivia.

Jeff Mullen



Jeff Mullen graduated from Norwich Free Academy in 1969 after playing football and being on the teams for four years. While playing as a lineman, he sustained a serious knee injury which cut his football career short. He went to Mitchell College and UCONN. In 1970 he began to coach football at various levels: youth, high school, and college and was successful at all of them.

He was given an assistant position at Donald Trump's team in the World Football League prior to the Leagues' inaugural season. He began to coach and serve on the Board of Directors of the Norwich Midget Football League in 1970. Jeff went then served as defensive coach for New London High School and t. Thomas More prep School for several years.

Jeff went on to coach at Griswold High School in 1976 and turned a weak program into a QVC conference program champion in two years. He was the youngest high school head coach in Connecticut at the age of 25. Jeff became the head coach of the varsity track team and was credited with raising thousands of dollars for the football team. After establishing the Griswold Football Hall of fame in 1977, he moved to UCONN, where he was a defensive line and strength coach for two years. He then signed on at the Coast Guard Academy where he was a defensive and offensive line and strength coach for two years. He served under head coach Walt Nadzack at UCONN and Larry Rutledge at the Coast Guard Academy, two well-known coaches in the area from 1978-1981.

After coaching in college, Jeff returned to high school and prep school with New London High and St. Thomas More.

In 1982, Jeff started Action Amusements and Venting LLC, a successful business venture. From that time to the present, he has been instrumental in rebuilding Ocean Beach Park. New London to its former glory. He bought and rebuilt the arcade, merry-Go- round, and sixteen antique amusement rides, and the water slide; in which there are only two left of that style in the country. He has worked tirelessly over the years making the park better for the community and the region.

His talents as a man with passion for life in whatever he attempted to do, and his legacy in Norwich and Eastern Connecticut is that he made the community a better place.

Joseph Kapteina Service Award

Bryan Lawson



A native son of Norwich, Bryan Lawson became active in organized sports at an incredibly early age. From little league baseball, church league basketball, PAL basketball, rec league softball, or peewee football, Bryan was infatuated with any sport that gave him a chance to have fun and show off his natural athletic ability.

As a teenager, Bryan attended and played for St. Bernard's Catholic High School in Montville, transferring to Norwich Free Academy and finishing his high school career at Norwich Tech in 1979.

After high school, he went on to play city league basketball for Ogulnick Jewelers, Rose City Glass, and Jerry's Appliance, as well as softball for Indian Leap, Log 'N' Lantern, and First Baptist Church.

Because he cherished his own experiences in youth sports and knew the positive impact athletics could have on kids, he became a coach for the Norwich Little League in 1985. The organization remains close to his heart, reflecting a childhood spent playing for winning teams in the league.

In 1998, under the direction of Athletic Director Gary Makowicki, Bryan became the announcer of basketball and football games at NFA. Having loved the sport for so many years, he enjoyed announcing basketball games in Alumni Hall, but his heart was always on the football field.

Many in Norwich recognized Bryan as "the voice of the Wildcats," and he has long considered this the highest praise. In his tenure as announcer for NFA football, Bryan set a record for consecutive games announced and was recognized by both the team and the athletic department. After 20 years, Bryan switched off his microphone in 2017 after announcing 105 football games and countless basketball games. He remained at NFA as a member of the Campus Safety department and until his retirement in June of last year.

Bryan lives in Norwich with his wife Robin. His daughters Amy and Christina live in Rhode Island and South Carolina respectively with their husbands and children. Bryan works part-time at Malerba's Driving Range during golf season where he enjoys talking sports with customers.

Sportsperson of the Year

Roy Wentworth



Roy Wentworth's connection to Norwich began in 1980 when he moved from Tilton, New Hampshire as a 14-year-old sophomore to the Norwich Free Academy. The move became the start of a lifelong relationship with a wide community that would shape the rest of his and other lives. After 46 years at NFA Roy retired in January 2026 from his role as Director of Athletics. The year 2026 stands out as one milestone of his contribution to Norwich education, athletics and community.

An early milestone in Roy's journey was his connection to wrestling and Coach Carl Snitkin. Under the guidance of legendary coach Carl Snitkin, Roy discovered both his passion and his confidence. Despite weighing just over 100 pounds as a young wrestler, he worked relentlessly to improve. By his senior year in 1983, he helped lead the Wildcats to their first Wrestling Class LL State Championship, the beginning of an extraordinary run for the program.

That experience inspired Roy to give back to the program that had given him so much. Soon after graduating from NFA and while attending Eastern Connecticut State University, he returned to NFA as an assistant Wrestling coach. For 16 seasons, he coached alongside his mentor Coach Carl Snitkin, helping guide the Wildcats through one of the most successful eras in Connecticut wrestling history. Roy later served as Head Wrestling coach for 13 seasons.

Roy's contributions to Norwich Free Academy extend far beyond wrestling. For 16 years, he served as a Science teacher and also served numerous other roles over the decades. He coached Wrestling, Football, and Girls' Golf. He was the Night School Director, In-school Suspension Supervisor and Director of Summer School for 7 years. His greatest rewards were watching the teams, coaches, athletes, and students succeed.

In 2019, Roy became NFA's Athletic Director, overseeing more than 30 sports and 50 teams. During his eight-year tenure as the Athletic Director, Roy hired over 200 coaches. He guided the department through the unprecedented challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic while maintaining a focus on safety, opportunity, and the student-athlete experience.

Roy Wentworth's 46-year connection to Norwich Free Academy reflects a lifetime of dedication to education, athletics, and community.

Roy currently lives in Norwich with his wife Susan also spending time visiting son Bennington, his wife Kimya and two grandkids; Cyrus and Soraya.

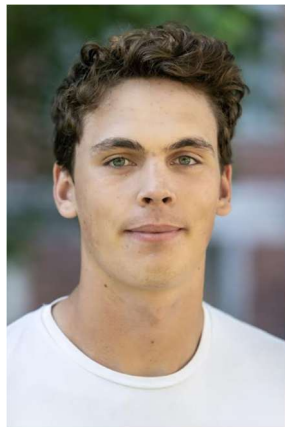

INDUCTEES: An applicant must be at least 35 years of age, must have been a resident of Norwich, attended school in Norwich or contributed to Norwich based athletics.
Deceased candidates are also considered.

Joseph Kapteina Award candidates are considered based on their contributions in other athletic endeavors such as outstanding community service.
There are no age requirements for this award.

Sportsperson of the Year candidates shall be selected on the basis of athletic achievement during the most recent year.
Age is not a consideration.

The Legends Team Recognition is selected based on a team's dominance in their field of sports in the Norwich area.
